International context for QA in higher education

- Internationalisation of education and research
- Increasing number of providers in HE / new providers
- Increasing autonomy of HE institutions

ECA: Foundation and Aim

- Established in November 2003 as project organisation
- Consortium of national accreditation/QA agencies
- 17 member organisations from 11 European countries: all regions involved
- Primary aim: Mutual recognition of accreditation decisions

Political basis for MR initiatives in Europe

Bologna Ministers Conference, Bergen 2005: "We underline the importance of cooperation between nationally recognised agencies with a view to enhancing the mutual recognition of accreditation or quality assurance decisions".

Joint Programmes (JP) in the EHEA

- JPs are on top of the European HE-agenda
- > 150 Erasmus Mundus master programmes
- Estimated total number of JPs: 2500
- Obstacles for HEIs in organizing JPs
- Multiple problems with recognition of qualifications awarded by JPs
- Challenges in the Accreditation/QA of JPs

Challenges in Accreditation of Joint Programmes

- Joint programmes are confronted with different national QA regimes
- There is no single QA/accreditation procedure
- Multiple visits, multiple panels, multiple decisions
- Decisions may only have an influence on national system

JOQAR project of ECA (2010-2013)

- Aim: facilitate both accreditation and recognition of joint programmes in the EHEA
- Objectives in domain accreditation: promote single accreditation procedures for JP; establish European coordination point
- Objectives in domain recognition: agreed princiles among ENIC/NARICs; guidelines for HEIs;
- 14 partner organizations (Accreditation agencies and Recognition centers)



ECA solution - Single Accreditation Procedures

- One single accreditation procedure, replacing multiple accreditation procedures
- Based on ECA principles for accreditation of JPs and on mutual trust building activities
- One coordinating QAA, others are observing
- I on-site visit, 1 report, multiple (but same!) decision
- Five pilot-tests successfully carried out and evaluated (see: www.ecaconsortium.net)

Recognition of Joint Degrees – the Way forward

Guidelines for awarding joint degrees (aimed at HEIs)
>30 recommendations, concerning the awarding institutions, the joint programme, the joint degree, and the diploma supplement

Recommendation for recognizing joint degrees (aimed at credential evaluators)

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 \rightarrow Final documents will be published in fall 2012

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ECA: Lessons learned

- MR agreements between QAA's can be reached, on the basis of cooperation, evidence and mutual trust
- MR agreements help to simplify the accrediation of joint programmes (single procedure)
- MR agreements have the potential to facilitate transborder recognition of qualifications
- Involvement of national goverments, credential evaluators and HEIs is needed

A look into the future and conclusions

- MR initiatives in QA should be encouraged within and outside of the ECA group
- On the basis of MR agreements single accreditation procedures of JPs can be carried out
- MR decisions in QA should be incorporated into the recognition procedures of all degrees/qualifications
- Such a policy will facilitate and enhance international mobility of students and staff
